

## **Paul's first visit to Philippi and the people he encountered**

1. (Acts 16:14,15) **Lydia – a seller of purple.**
  - She was a leading woman who represented the Asiatic upper class merchant
  - Her entire household was saved
  - Paul and Silas stayed with her
    - Shows that woman did have an important place in society (Greek)
  
2. (Acts 16:27-34) **The Roman jailer.**
  - He represented the Roman middle class
  - His whole family was eventually saved
    - He could have influence into other Roman officials' lives
  
3. (Acts 16:16-18) **The slave-girl who was used by her master for fortune telling.**
  - She represented the Greek lower class
  - Spirit of divination came out of her, but no proof that she was actually saved
    - She could find purpose and a calling in her life through Jesus rather than being used by someone else
