

Evidence that Paul was imprisoned in Rome when Philippians was written

1. Acts 28 tells us that Paul was in prison at Rome. He was imprisoned there for 2 years.
 - This would have given him time to visit Philippi
 - (7 week journey).
2. (Phil. 1:13) “Imperial Guard” – Nelson’s Dictionary
They were a special group of **Roman** soldiers established to guard the **emperor**. Originally they were restricted to the city of Rome, but later they were sent to the Roman provinces as well.
3. (Phil. 4:22) “Caesar’s household” – Nelson’s Dictionary
all of the slaves and freeman who were employed by the **imperial administration** who lived throughout **Italy** and the provinces.
