Korah/ KORAHITES - that part of the Kohathite Levites descended from KORAH, the son of Izhar and grandson of Levi. **Many Korahites held responsible tabernacle positions** <Ex. 6:24>. The name is also spelled Korathites <Num. 26:58>. The KJV translates as Korhites.

ASAPH - Asaph **sounded cymbals before the ARK OF THE COVENANT** when it was moved from the house of Obed-Edom to Jerusalem <1Chr. 15:16-19>. **Asaph's family became one of the three families given responsibility for music and song in the Temple** <1Chr. 25:1-9>.

Following the Captivity, 128 singers from this family returned from Babylon and conducted the singing when the foundations of Zerubbabel's temple were laid <Ezra 2:41; 3:10>.

ETHAN the Ezrahite - A renowned wise man in the time of Solomon <1King. 4:31>. OR, a descendant of Gershon and an ancestor of Asaph <1Chr. 6:42>.

HEMAN the Ezrahite - A son of Zerah and grandson of Jacob. Heman composed a meditative psalm, a prayer for deliverance from sadness <Ps. 88>

OR, a son of Joel and a grandson of Samuel the prophet <1Chr. 6:33; 15:17>.

Presented as **"the singer" or "the musician,"** he was **the first of three chief Levites to conduct the vocal and instrumental music of the tabernacle during the reign of David** <1Chr. 16:41-42>.
